


The Wandering Investor




Following on Seas of Glory Adventures at Sea and Around the World

The story begins with a talented young man who invented and patented a marine engine around 1900 which began a maritime tradition in the family which would span three generations. The story moves to the youngest of his three sons who has a yearning to venture out on the sea. He fulfills this desire by attending the New York State Merchant Marine Academy where he makes a transatlantic voyage on the school ship SS Newport, a three masted sailing ship in 1924. There are storms but a safe arrival home. Finally, the third generation of men in this family graduates from college but makes an abrupt decision to join the Navy instead of attending law school. His exploits in the Navy include graduating from Naval Justice School, a fate he tried to avoid, and then serving as personnel and legal officer at a small communication station on the island of Guam in the mid 1960s. He continues searching for his dream by landing a seagoing assignment on an aircraft carrier headed for Viet Nam, working in the Combat Information Center (CIC) tracking live enemy contacts, and finally completing a circumnavigation of the world by traveling west across the South China Sea to Cape Town, SA and then home, traveling northwest across the Atlantic Ocean. He completes his active duty service with a new job on the aircraft carrier and a deployment to the Mediterranean Sea. Although he thought he was done with the military when he was discharged from active duty in 1968, that was not to be the case. Through a strange twist of fate, the young man begins to realize that his attachment to the Navy and the maritime life is more permanent than he realized and he continues in the Reserves for 21 more years collecting some very powerful experiences a long the way such as a close call with an angry mob in Rome and the sinking of a Navy destroyer on the Island of Rhodes. Just as there is a wider ocean that extends beyond the shore, there is understanding that lets us see beyond ourselves.




The Seven Year Hitch




Chasing Zorba A Journey of Self-Discovery in a VW Bus

Jerry Steimel

In 1972, after graduating from college, Jerry Steimel set out on a cross-country road trip in a 1966 VW Beetle he called Zorba – named after the literary figure, Zorba the Greek. In Zorba, the author Nikos Kazantzakis had created an image and a philosophy about life that inspired him. Zorba's commitment to grasping tightly to the present and living life without fear was something Steimel strived to adopt. On his road trip in 1972 Steimel aimed to explore America's back roads—the country sharply divided over the war in Vietnam—and break away from his hometown of Louisville, Kentucky. Along the way, he sought to gain a deeper understanding of himself and the path his life would take. His goal: get to California and see what he could learn along the way. However, the Beetle he chose for the journey suffered mechanical failure on the first day in a small town in Alabama, only 300 miles from the journey's starting point. Resisting a return to his hometown, Steimel attempted to sustain himself in Pensacola, Florida. After one month his resources were expended and he was forced to return to Louisville and put his dream of driving across America on the shelf. After receiving a Masters Degree in social work, Steimel pursued a career working with disadvantaged children in a variety of settings, ultimately settling on the East coast. He married and raised two daughters—a life well-lived—and he continued to pursue Zorba's approach to life holding the author Kazantzakis in his mind as a mentor. But always a feeling lingered that he had some unfinished business. Forty-five years after his first attempt at a cross-country road trip in an old VW, Steimel retired and began searching for a vintage VW bus that could help him fulfill his dream. It was 2017, the first year of the Trump Presidency and the country was again in conflict with itself. Steimel took his dream off the shelf, and in a 1973 VW bus began a new journey of self-discovery on the back roads of America. He saw the road trip as a test of how close he had come in his pursuit of Zorba the Greek. It was a dream deferred, but not forgotten.






Time to Journey Home The Story of Our Stories

Time to Journey Home is the story about the author's trip back to the small valley in Northern Italy that his ancestors called home for a thousand years before immigrating to a small Midwestern town in the mid-nineteenth century. While there Pedretti was inspired to write *The Story of Our Stories*, a twelve book epic designed to tell our story - of how our ancestors came to America, how America shaped them and how they shaped America. In this travelogue to discover his family history - his ancestry - the author explains how he prepared for the trip, whom he met on his journey and how he succeeded in adding nearly fifty ancestors to his family tree. Follow him in his genealogical search through the uncovering of church documents that identify the births, weddings and deaths of his family and how meeting others in search of their families often overlapped with his own research. Still his objective was not so much a genealogical search as it was a search to discover what shaped the way of life his ancestors had come to live. While visiting and meeting the people and the land, the author sees a kind and gentle people who seemed completely in synch with the beauty and majesty of the Alps. You will read about some very real imaginary conversations he had with a couple of his nineteenth century ancestors. Join the author as he visits the homes, churches, streets, and mountainsides where his ancestors had once lived. The first immigrants of our family saga settled in the small township of Bad Ax, Wisconsin. The book includes the story of rough-and-tough Bad Ax City evolving into Genoa, Wisconsin—the home of a spray drift of calm. This town will be center to much of the epic series. The author includes a manifesto calling for a new epic for the modern world. Historically epics helped to define who the culture was and provided the citizens a moral compass by which to live and make choices. The epics we know from the early ages celebrated man and war. The author believes the modern epic must celebrate woman and kindness. The new epic hero must be a planter rather than a warrior-destroyer. The new epic hero will be mother, the woman who shapes and defines the family and the world where kindness, creativity and empathy will rule. Each book will contain a piece that explores an idea that the people of this family saga might have written. In this book, the author reveals the great inequality perpetrated by the Social Security Act and offers a fail-safe solution to equalize and perpetuate a secure retirement for all ad infinitum. The appendix includes an ancestral history of the author at the start of his journey and the autobiographies of select persons, who researched the family's ancestry. *The Story of Our Stories* is the story of Marianna and Petronella, Peter and John, Adelaide and Stefano, and Agnes and her children and her grandchildren. It is about the individuals who peopled the Mount of San Bernardo and Valle Spluga who turned the roughness of Bad Ax City into the gentleness of Genoa, Wisconsin; but first and foremost it is our story, the story of you and me. Our story is written as an epic composed of twelve books, each with a supportive appendix. Each book covers a different story. Some cover the life of a typical family member of a specific generation; others reflect many people of a generation; another traces the entire story from beginning to now; and one looks into a future predicated by the behavior of our mothers. Each volume tells a critical part of the story, is an integral part of the whole, and plays into the unfolding of the epic. While part of a whole, each book can be read independent of the rest.




The Alaskan Tundra and Brooks Range MisterParks Travels

This book is the first of a planned series that documents the National Parks within an ecological framework. The book starts with detailed ecological descriptions of this zone and the seven sub-regions that make it up. These descriptions, accompanied by detailed maps, focus on the geology, geography, climate, vegetation, wildlife, and human activity found on the Tundra. Then there is a brief overview of the history of the region paying particular attention to the pre-history of native settlement thousands of years ago. Included also is a story, based on our travels, that compares and contrasts four tundra towns that we visited - Anaktuvuk Pass, Kotzebue, Nome and King Salmon. Interspersed are descriptions of the nine National Park units located in this region, including special attention to the four that we visited. The book ends on a more personal note with some reflections on the impact - Impressions - of the Alaskan Tundra on the author. The concluding sections include resources to help others in planning their own trips to the region.




The Alaskan Boreal Interior MisterParks Travels




Backpacking Centurion A Northern Irishman's Journey Through 100 Countries Volume 1 - Don't Look Back in Bangor

"Slip inside the eye of your mind" - Noel Gallagher. When Jonny Blair's 100-country book "*Backpacking Centurion*" was completed in August 2015, it was supposed to be released soon after that, and as a one-off book. That didn't exactly happen the way it was intended. Over the next five years, as Jonny continued on his travels, it became clear that chapter after chapter needed to be re-edited, re-positioned and in some cases, removed, delayed or in other cases - posted faster and onto the online travel blog "Don't Stop Living", which meant they didn't make the book as they made the blog. In those five years, unfortunately depression kicked in and was the major reason for the book's delay. It was even possible that the book would never see the light of day at all. In 2019, it became clear that the book needed to be split into three volumes, and not all released at the same time. These three volumes are more or less in chronological order and are now being released one by one. The first one, here with its volume title "Don't Look Back In Bangor" is finally here in print. Don't Look Back in Bangor, the first volume of *Backpacking Centurion* begins where it all began for Jonny Blair. That means the seaside town of Bangor in Northern Ireland. The year is 1980. Jonny will take you on a "fool circle" here as he details his childhood with footballic zest. Jonny's topsy turvy time at Bangor Grammar School is encapsulated in an enthralling chapter trilogy of teenage angst. Delve into Jonny's early tourist days of visiting The Netherlands, France and significantly Bournemouth in 1994. Seaside beach towns beginning with B on the brain, it was here in an unlikely ice cream hut where this nationalistic Northern Irishman found a hunger for global travel. Weekend trips to Burnley, Colchester and Portsmouth soon became backpacking adventures to Belarus, China and Poland. The odyssey really kicked off when Jonny was in his twenties, which is where this first volume ends to prepare us for volume two. This is a real life journey of ups and downs. Expect some regretful bad boy behaviour, unashamed nudity and vintage banter as Jonny injects humour, sincerity and openness to his life of tears, fears and elation. By the end of this volume, Jonny will have gone through failed romances, an arm break, a leg break and some wacky trips to lands afar watching the Northern Ireland football team. He will have you gagging for volume two, where in essence the real 100 country quest begins to dominate proceedings. The volume's title and much of its theme reflects on Jonny's desire not to look back at what has been and gone. Doors are closed and his Bangor hometown was left behind. In true poetic Noel Gallagher fashion, Jonny's soul slides away, but don't look back in Bangor, we heard him say.


A Reluctant Missionary An Everyday Mama Shoved by God into a Sierra Leone Adventure

I never wanted to go to Africa on a mission trip. God shoved me into one, my every objection answered. I looked forward to recording my experience in writing and radio bits. Sierra Leone was so different from the world I knew! As I waded into my days, the pages remained empty and I felt I had lost my voice. I found myself unable to communicate beyond a few moments captured here and there in haiku. In Sierra Leone, I found it simpler to restrict what I felt in my heart to this pattern. "*A Reluctant Missionary*" is a collection of the 54 haiku and photographs of Sierra Leone.

In 1959 Renate returned to the Canadian Rockies to work in the backcountry, and in 1960 she married mountaineer Felix Belczyk and settled in Castlegar, BC, where they raised three children.

Our Trip Around the World is an endearing snapshot of the postwar era when adventure travel - mountaineering, hiking, hitchhiking, and cycling - was enticing those with adventurous spirits to experience the world like never before.
